A will is a document that states who will get what, after you die. Even if you have a trust, a will is a separate document that can earmark specific items for a beneficiary. (An heirloom piece of jewelry to a specific grandchild, for example.) Even if you have very little to leave behind, in a will you can name an executor, the one who will attend to the payment of bills, clearing up of accounts and carry out your wishes.

Distinct from a will, a "living will" is a legal document which states that you do not want life-sustaining treatment to be done for you when there is no hope of recovery. It is also referred to as a health care directive. In addition to stating your treatment instructions, it should also designate someone who has the durable power of attorney for health care should you be unable to make your own decisions.

You can draw up both of these documents with forms often available from a good business-oriented stationary store. But if you are not sure about what you are doing, it will be
